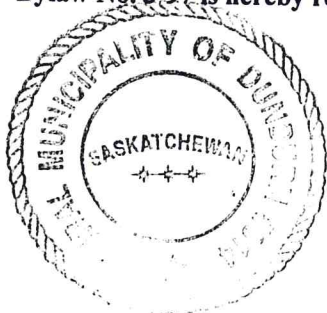


BYLAW NO. 04-07

A BYLAW OF THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF DUNDURN NO. 314
TO ESTABLISH A HAYING POLICY

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Dundurn No. 314 in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. For the purpose of this bylaw the expression:
 - a. "municipality" means the Rural Municipality of Dundurn, No. 314.
 - b. "road" means a "public highway" as defined by The Municipalities Act.
2. Conditions for the salvage of hay from a road in the municipality.
 - a. The adjacent landowner or lessee in the case of rented land, has first option to salvage hay along a municipal road. Other persons must contact the adjacent landowner or lessee to salvage the hay on or before July 15 each year.
 - b. After July 15, any person may cut and salvage hay without the permission of the adjacent landowner or lessee, provided the adjacent landowner or lessee has not begun salvage operations.
 - c. The road right of way must be left in a neat appearance by the person salvaging the hay.
 - d. Bales of hay must be a least 8 metres from the edge of the shoulder of the roadway.
 - e. All bales must be removed from the road right of way before August 15 of the year of baling, or the municipality shall have the right to remove the bales, with the bales so removed becoming the property of the municipality, and the cost for the said bale removal shall be considered as custom work and charged as such to the original party salvaging the hay.
 - f. The Council reserves the privilege and right for its members, employees and/or agent to enter upon said road right of way for the maintenance and or reconstruction of said roadway or for other such purposes may be deemed necessary, and at no compensation or reimbursement to the party salvaging the hay therefrom.
 - g. The municipality assumes no liability for laborers, machinery or bales relating to the salvage of hay operations.
 - h. No person shall cut hay on any portion of a road right of way located in this municipality so as to obstruct the traveled portion of the road.
3. Bylaw No. 3-97 is hereby repealed.
